Tram operator Midland Metro Limited (MML) has announced the appointment of a new Non-Executive Director as it prepares for future network expansion.

With over 40 years' experience in the rail industry, Richard Brooks joins the MML board as the business gears up for the launch of services to Dudley next year.

A former Customer Experience Director at West Midlands Trains, and previously a Commercial Director at London Midland, more recently he has served as a Non-Executive Director and Trustee of Stour Vale Academy Trust.
